What follows is a hoax perpetrated by Government Agents in conjunction with Cuyahoga County Assistant County Prosecutors against the system of justice itself to cover-up their own illegal activities.

Assistant Cuyahoga County Prosecutor "Gasper said to protect (Judge) Gaul, us and others we had to indict Loeser for obstruction of justice thus knocking out her credibility". Gasper, was however eventually pushed out of the prosecutor's office over the entire business.

## Woman sought in intimidation, perjury, obstruction cases

Cuyahoga Fugitive Task Force are seeking a woman charged with , several counts of tampering with evidence, perjury, bribery, intimidation and obstruction of justice.



Barbara

Loesser, 41, of Parma, is being

sought on a September 1997 federal fugitive warrant and warrants issued in January 1998 by Cuyahoga County Common Pleas Court. The warrants involve two court cases in which she was involved, according to the FBI.

In 1993, she filed false charges against a former boyfriend and her ex-husband, claiming they had physically abused her and induced miscarriages, the FBI said.

Then in 1996, Loesser contacted witnesses in a string of criminal cases against former lawyer Jeffrey Keith, identifying herself as reporter Chris Lawrence of the Downtown Tab and attempting to intimidate them, according to the FBI.

Loesser also uses the names of Barbara M. Cingel, Barbara M. Carr and Barbara C. Lawrence, authorities said.

She is described as white, 4 feet 11 and 120 pounds. She has brown eyes and hair and pierced ears.

Anyone with information regarding Loesser, or other fugitives being sought for violent crimes, may call the task force at (216) 522-1400. The identity of callers will remain confidential. Reward money is available.

The task force includes members of the Cuyahoga County Sheriff's Department, U.S. Mar-shals Service, the FBI, the Cleveland Police Department and the Ohio Adult Parole Authority.

Its task is arresting fugitives charged with such crimes as homicide, bank robbery, kidnapping, rape and sexual assault, felonious assault and arson.
